

#### **Agenda 5- AQAR Documentation**


The process of AQAR documentation was discussed. It was decided to allot three days to each criterion for data collection and documentation and verify the data and documents in the third week of April.


#### Agenda 8- Planning of Insolito

#### Agenda 6 – Semester VI Results of the University of Mumbai



# Agenda 7- Mumbai University Intercollegiate Youth Festival


